Minutes from the Professional Soil Scientists Association of Texas Annual Meeting February 5, 2020 - kindly provided by Amanda Bragg

Meeting called to order at 7:04 p.m.

Cole Patton, PSSAT Vice-President, thanked everyone for coming. President Dr. McGahan was not able to attend the meeting.

Minutes from the previous year were approved.

Chair reports announcement: there were 15 vacancies on most of our committees

He currently has two lists: 1. mainly comprised of soil survey authors, and staff; and 2. includes soil survey staff, years worked, and number of surveys worked. He seems to be missing Brewster County, Main Part, but is pretty sure he has a draft of this survey up at office.

Jamey writes: "Perhaps in retirement, I could setup an database of name, Agency, survey range, College, Hometown or birthplace, and any funny stories."

"Lots of retired SCS/NRCS soil scientists may have stories to tell. I started in 1981, and never had the chance to work with, or know those who preceded me. There might be some typos for names. Is Jack C. Williams the same as Jack W. Williams? There are two Steven Park, and Stephen S. Parks, is this the same person? Also, there is a Herbert C. Stoner and a Herbert W.
